MS. 2936
 In reply to your despatch No. 750 of
 the 12th August, I have the honour to inform
 you that a thorough enquiry has been made into
 the loss of plants by Mr. Cooper but without
 any satisfactory result.

2. I observe that Mr. Cooper states that
 the plants were despatched by the S.S. "Burger-
 meister" which sailed from London on the 18th
 March and that they were taken out by Mr. John
 Scott. No such gentleman however can be traced
 as having arrived by that steamer but the name
 of Mr. John Scott appears amongst the list of
 passengers who arrived by the S.S. "Llanstephan
 Castle" a month before.

3. It would appear that the consignee was
