o. 180 November 4th your telegram of 9 October 12th
referring to financial position after carefully re-viewing the whole situation I estimate that although
most drastic economies will be exercised, deficit of
£160,000 will be shown in the year's accounts. The
greater part of our liquid assets will be thereby
absorbed and only little will be left wherewith to
defray the heavy expenditure entailed by the defence
of the Protectorate. Additional funds could be
temporarily provided as follows subject to your
approval. (1) exercise power under clause 6 of agreement
with National Bank of India to "borrow £20,000
(2) use the £117,000 available in a sum from one
loan of £200,000. I propose in the event of these
amounts being insufficient that we agree an
entered into with the Bank authorising for an extension
of powers to borrow from the bank and that we receive
in advance of money from the Crown borrowed from
funds which are in their possession or to be raised by
them. I hope to produce a budget for 1915 - 1916
which will balance, after allowing has been made for
interest on the same borrowed as above suggested.
