Sir,

With reference to your telegram of September 22nd respecting the grant of allowances to the Special Service Officers, Marehan Patrol, I have the honour to inform you that I consider that the allowances laid down in paragraph 211 of the King's African Rifles Regulations should be granted to the four special service officers and I recommend that these be allowed.

2. I am also of opinion that paragraphs 216, 217 and 218 and exhibit "D" of the Regulations should apply also in the case of the Special Service Non-Commissioned Officers and clerks.

3. As soon as your sanction to this is received various adjustments to salaries will have to be made e.g. the special service officers would not receive their local Indian allowances as well as their special service allowance.
