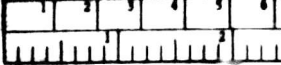

As the financial position will necessitate postponement to a large extent of new scheme of reorganization of northern frontier and Somalis already approved see your despatch of 3rd July Confidential I request that action may be suspended for the present as regards appointment of Civil Administrator purchase of river craft and recruitment of Abyssinians. Propose to insert in Draft Estimates lump sum against which would be charged cost of any portion of reorganization scheme which it may be possible to introduce before March 31st 1916.
