

Instructions

Instructions referred to on page 1

If this Paper of Particulars and the Certificates connected with it, be not sent in original, the copies must be duly attested.

- Head 1. of Paper**—In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be added whether he is a native of that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, § 430).
- Head 2.**—State the description of Allowance for which the Applicant is recommended, viz., Superannuation, Compensatory, Commission, Allowance, or Gratuity, and its amount. In the case of Persons joining an addition to their Pensions in respect of Professional or other special qualifications, this should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.
- Head 3.**—If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be added before or after the number of years and months, and the causes, dates, and circumstances of the break or breaks should be stated under heading 9.
- Head 4.**—If the Person retiring has been in receipt of the same Salary, or of the class from which he retires, for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual annual rate of Salary or Wages at that date should be inserted, preceded by the word "actual." In other cases the average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "average," but if the whole period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.
- Head 5.**—A special statement should be inserted of the average Annual Value for the term attested, duly provided for, of each Employment, exclusive of salary or wages, which is claimed to be included in the Pension, in the case of the Pensioner's territory.
- When the value of the House or House Allowance is ascertained by any means, or by the salary and other emoluments which should be taken into account, it is to be returned in some extent of that amount, so that the value of the Pension may be ascertained by the sum of the two.
- Fees paid for the purpose of the Pension should be returned for his own use, or taken into account for Pension purposes, and returned as the annual average of the net receipts of the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement. This net receipt is to be ascertained by deducting from the gross amount of Fees, such other expenses as an officer may have had to pay from his own resources, or performance of the duties of his office, as was enumerated in Fees, No. 1, and in the discharge of those duties to which a fixed salary is annexed. Papers of Particulars, when forwarded to the Colonial Department, should be accompanied by formal Declarations from the retiring Officers, showing the amount received by them for Fees, and the amount defrayed as above for other expenses, &c. In each of the three years immediately preceding the retirement, as well as the duty of the Colonial Government to ascertain to satisfy themselves of the accuracy of the statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Fixed Salaries, if Fees, the Fees will not be returned, and instances be set, will be counted for Pension purposes to the extent of fees that are returned of the Salaries, and Fees will not in any case be allowed to count for Pension purposes during any period in which the whole term of the Officer receiving them was not given to the Public Service.
- Head 6.**—In cases of a disability of the Applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Certificate is to be furnished, showing that he is disqualified by infirmity of mind or body for discharging the duties of his office, and that his infirmity is likely to be permanent.
- The Medical Certificate is to be signed by two Officers, of whom at least one should be a Salaried Officer of the Government.
- Head 7.**—A statement is to be given of the nature of the service, the details must be fully given, with a statement of the whole period during the service, and the service connected with the permanent Civil Service.
- Head 8.**—If a professional Civil Officer has been allowed to have a private practice, without interfering with his public Pension, the facts are to be fully stated.
- Head 9.**—If a person has been allowed to be absent from his service under Clause 102 of the Colonial Regulations, the facts are to be fully stated.
- Head 10.**—In the case of a person whose other particulars of the computation are to be given. When an average Annual Value is to be inserted, the mode of calculating it (whether by months, &c.) is to be explained.
