### Instructions referred to on page 1

If this Paper of Particulars and the Certificates connected with it, be not sent in original, the copies  
must be duly attested.

**Header 4.** - In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be added,  
whether he is native of that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, § 450).

**Header 5.** - State the description of Allowance for which the Applicant is recommended, viz., Superintendent  
Compensatory Compensation Allowance, or Gratuity, and its amount. In the case of Persons  
claiming an addition to their Pensions in respect of Professional or other special qualifications, this  
should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

**Header 5.** - If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be added  
before, or after the number of years and months, and the causes, dates and circumstances of the  
break or breaks should be stated under heading 9.

**Header 6.** - If the Person retiring has been in receipt of the same Salary, &c. by the class from which he  
retires, for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the salary and rate  
of Salary or Wages at that date should be inserted, preceded by the word "actual." In other cases the  
average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months next preceding the date of retire-  
ment should be inserted, preceded by the word "average," but if the whole period of service is less  
than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

**Header 7.** - A separate statement should be inserted of the average Annual Value for the 36 months immediately  
preceding the date of retirement, exclusive of salary or wages which may have been  
to be included in the calculation of the pension or gratuity.

**Wages.** - The value of the House or Houses, Allowances, &c. retained exceeds the sum of the  
salary, and other emoluments which save the Person paying such sum, be reduced to one-half of  
that amount, so that the balance will be the amount of the Wages.

**Fees.** - All fees and expenses paid or retained for his own use will be taken into account by the Pay-  
master General, and the annual average of the net receipts of the 36 months next  
preceding the date of retirement. These fees will be deducted from the  
gross amount of Pensions and other emoluments. As an officer may have more than one source from which his  
resources in pecuniary value may be derived, and was remunerated by fees. No deduction, however,  
from the fees should be made in respect of Office Expenses provided from Public Funds, &c. the due  
discharge of whose duties to which a fixed salary is annexed. Papers of "Particulars" which are  
warded to the Colonial Department should be accompanied by formal Despatches from the relevant  
Officer, showing the amount received by them for Fees, and the amount deducted as a sum for Office  
expenses, &c. for each of the three years immediately preceding the retirement, as well as the  
duty of the Colonial Government to remunerate themselves of the arrears, &c. of statements  
before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving fixed salaries and  
fees, the fees will not in ordinary circumstances be allowed to count for Pension purposes to the ex-  
tent of more than one-half of the Salaries, and fees will not in any case be allowed to count for  
Pension purposes during any period in which the whole time of the Officer receiving them was not  
given to the Public Service.

**Header 8.** - In case of disability of the Applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Certificate  
is to be produced showing that he is disqualified by infirmity of mind or body for discharging the  
duties of his present station, so that the infirmity is likely to be permanent.  
The certificate of the medical practitioner issuing this Certificate should be signed by two Officers, of  
whom at least one must be a Selected Officer of the Government.

**Header 9.** - Ask the question as follows:

If the Applicant has had other military service, the details must be fully given, with a statement  
as to whether or not during the same he was in the army connected with the permanent Civil Ser-  
vice, and if so, in what capacity.

**Header 10.** - Ask the question as follows: - Is the Applicant a professional Civil Officer has been allowed to have "private practice"  
or "private business" during his service? If so, state the facts and to be fully stated.

**Header 11.** - Ask the question as follows: - Has the Applicant obtained a separation from his service under Clause 102 of the Colonial  
Regulations? If so, give the date of separation.

**Header 12.** - Ask the question as follows: - What particulars of the compensation are to be given. When an avoca-  
tion is mentioned, &c. state the mode of calculating it (whether by months, &c.) is to be explained.
