VOLUNTEERS PENSIONS

Your telegram 30th October recommend that all European Volunteers in E.A.P. and Z'bar be treated as 1st class. Governor of Uganda concurs but has recommended in his despatch of October 19th that increased pensions may be granted in certain cases.

Introduction, Mr. Reid

Uganda and Z'bar agree to treat the volunteers as regularly enlisted, and to grant pension on the scale laid down in the Army Pay Warrant (as in tel. on 40943) As Uganda is concerned we shall have to go to Treasury but we had better wait for the promised despatch from Uganda, recommending increased pensions in certain cases.

The arrangement should be uniform in all the P.W.S. as I suppose that it would not be safe yet to deal with the W.S. Pension (29777) under para 1248 of A.P.W. am. and wait for Uganda A.P.W. despatch.

"1st class" refers of course to the two categories mentioned in the tel. on 40943 - viz. those
