Longido. My telegram of 8th November. Colonel
Drew reports Longido evacuated by Germans he is occupying
the place with 100 East African Mounted Infantry, two
companies 29th Punjabis, one company King's African Rifles,
and two mountain guns.

Subject to approval of General Officer Commanding
he proposes to make his advanced base at Longido he strongly
advises this course and adds that thereby morale of the
troops will be benefited.

Telegram. The Secretary of State for the Colonies to the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate.

(Sent 12.30 p.m. 19th November 1914).

Am much impressed by lack of accurate information as shown by result of Tanga operations. Have arrangements been made in East Africa Protectorate and Zanzibar for an intelligence department working through natives and are results satisfactory.
