Information received that patrol nine
East African Mounted Infantry three East African
Police attacked German patrol twenty six miles to
the west of Nguruman to the west of Lake Natron.
Enemy's casualties German in charge killed native
soldiers eight killed three wounded: our casualties
were Corporal James Hugh Barnes East African Mounted
Infantry wounded slightly next of kin informed.
We captured nine rifles 2000 rounds of ammunition.
