The Governor of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

(Received Colonial Office 7.5 p.m. 20th November 1914)

No. 196 November 20th.

Your cypher telegram of November 19th East Africa Protectorate Intelligence Department have been most efficiently organised and conducted. Both the European and natives of the staff have worked assiduously and successfully and have supplied most valuable information but its sphere of action has been properly limited to vicinity of German boundary, and as regards the strength and distribution of the enemy in the interior of his country no opportunity has occurred of acquiring such knowledge except such as can be deduced from unreliable native statements.

As to intelligence at Zanzibar I have received no information but I am making enquiry, I believe no reliable information is obtainable from the mainland.
