of the acre they could not be refused for  
other reason.
- (d) A report the Gold, one of his applications  
had a record, it is categorically established that  
a mineral lease will be granted over  
his land.

He found at Gwalia the highly - pointed out

he would have spent all his money & that  
if he were disabled he would be helpless.

I told him I would put the matter  
to you but that I felt perfectly  
certain that we could not offend  
the Govt again.
