In paragraph 10 of my Confidential despatch No. 90 of May 8th I intimated that I would not be in a position to make definite recommendations for increasing the number of Armed Constabulary in Jubaland above the amount approved on the current year's estimates, viz: 60 until civil administration had been re-established at Berenji.

2. In my despatch No. 711 of July 25th I enclosed a report by Captain Balkeld which contained his views on the future administration of the Jubaland Province, and I stated that, until I knew the extent to which you were prepared to agree with the suggestions for the future

future administration of Jubaland and the
Northern Frontier District which were enbo-
died in my Confidential Despatch of 1st March,
I did not propose to formulate further propos-
als.

3. In a telegram which I addressed to you on 10th July 1905 Captain Talkeid asked permission to re-
present an additional 50 Armed Constabulary
for the northern and southern areas referred to
in paragraph 2 of his report, in order that he might
attend to the administration of those districts
and that he might be duly acquainted with
the affairs of those districts so that he could
form a correct estimate of the number of men
required to meet any emergency that might occur.

4. I have now given him the number he has requested
and will send him 100 men on 1st August. I am sorry to
say I despatched him the following day, but
consequently I find in the correspondence contained
in Captain Talkeid's report nothing to indicate
that my previous instructions had been given.
However, in the event of the war in the
imminence of the Protectorate I am still unable
to make any detailed proposals and I regret
therefore I overlooked the matter and only
referred

reported the recruitment in the meantime of
the Armed Constabulary. I have now the honour
to request your approval of my action in the
matter.
