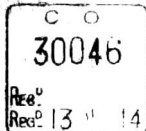

With reference to your letter of 21st July 1914 of the 25th June 1914 regarding certain appointments to the staff of the Uganda Railway, I have the honour to inform you that Mr. V.B. Meville, Chief Mechanical Engineer of the Uganda Railway, informed us before his departure that it would be preferable to employ the men for three months of agreement for twelve months only in the first instance, in order that if they were found to be in any way unsuitable their services might be more easily dispensed with, and to enquire whether this may be done.

3. The standard 2nd class Uganda Railway agreement provides for 3 years engagement in the first instance.
