In continuation of our letter of the 6th instant, I have the honour to report that, in accordance with your un-official request of the 18th instant, we telegraphed to the Government of the East Africa Protectorate on the 18th instant as follows:-

"Account overpaid £49,000 Can you remit funds
"or how do you propose to meet expenditure
"please inform us what is amount of cash balance
"at present available locally against which
"temporary advances could be made by us if
"necessary. State expenditure incurred to date
"under loan of £250,000 Telegraph reply please".

And we have today received the following reply under date the 20th instant:-

"See your telegram of 18th August cash balance
"at present available approximately £217,000
"Expenditure incurred under loan of £250,000
"approximately £132,000 Propose to send remittance
"£250,000 by mail of 31st August. May I suggest
"you should apply for further advances against
"loan in view of local revenue being reduced and
"local heavy expenditure on account of outbreak
"of war".
