
3. We have received a telegram from the Manager Uganda Railway this week asking us to delay executing the orders on this indent. As it does not appear likely that delivery will in any case be obtained before the middle of next year, and as our experience of deliveries promised by the Leeds Forge Co. of late has not been satisfactory, we consider that it would be advisable for the work to proceed as ordered. We shall, however, be glad to receive the Secretary of State's immediate instructions on this point.

4. Pending your reply, we have not instructed the firms concerned to stop work, because to do so will almost inevitably cause eventual delay. If, however, the orders are to be cancelled, this should be done at once, and it is most necessary therefore that we should receive early instructions.

Gentlemen,

We beg to acknowledge receipt of your favour of the 21st instant re accelerating delivery of the Bogie Open Wagons under above Requisition.

We have been giving this the closest attention as we are most desirous to meet your wishes in this matter. We are making special arrangements to push forward the building of these wagons, but we fear that in view of the circumstances in which we are now placed, we would not be justified in giving any definite undertaking.

As you are aware the war has put great difficulties in the way of completion of the Contracts which we now have on hand. We have already lost a large number of workmen and draughtsmen, and this loss will certainly become greater as recruiting is being very urgently advocated in this district. Many of our workmen are specialists and we find them difficult to replace in ordinary times, and now we find it almost impossible.

We thank you for suggesting a bonus to help us to accelerate the contracts, but the acceptance of any such on our part would not affect our efforts as in any case we shall do our best and spare no effort by working overtime or other means to expedite delivery. It will

be a great satisfaction to us if we succeed.
