the General Manager of the Uganda Railway.

Interviews with you on 21st. and 23rd. September, and writing you as to Messrs. Pauling & Co. Ltd., being allowed to submit a tender for the construction of the proposed works.

Exhibiting the drawings to the competing Contractors and answering their queries.

Examining the samples of stone and sand received from the Protectorate, and arranging for a series of tests to be made and considering the results of the same as to the suitability or otherwise of the material for the proposed works.

Professional services and general correspondence in connection with the foregoing up to 30th. September, 1914.

Personal services, staff, office expenses and disbursements, including a payment to Mr. Stanger of 25 guineas for carrying out the tests above mentioned.
