Mr. Read,

With reference to E.A.P./1049/14, I now attach further correspondence on the subject of lighting Government House with electricity. It appears to me to be evident that, unless otherwise instructed by the Secretary of State, the Governor does not propose to pay any portion of the cost. I suggest, therefore, that, if you agree that the S.Nigeria ruling should be applied to East Africa, the Governor should be definitely informed to that effect by despatch.

I have the honour
to inform you that the
Director of Colonial Audit
has referred to me the
recent correspondence between
the Chief Secretary and
the Auditor on the
subject of the incidence
of the cost of lighting
Government House.

In my opinion
that the cost of lighting a
fort house should be

divided between the Govt. (or Officer Administering the fort) and the Col. fort. on the same basis ^{that on which} furniture is provided - i.e. Let where the Govt. pays rent for the furniture of a room in Govt. House he should also pay for the lighting of that room. Accordingly the cost of lighting the rooms used for the public reception of Company and the officers used by the Govt. or by his Adj. Sec. or Aide-de-camp may be borne by Govt. Funds, &c. the cost of lighting all bedrooms, kitchens, & all other rooms not used for the public reception of company should be defrayed by the Govt. or O.A. the fort.

3. I consider that this rule should come into force ~~as from the 1st of April 1914.~~ ^{for rooms}
