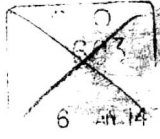

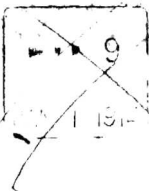

BRITISH LEGATION.

ADIS ABABA.

5th. December. 1913.



Sir,

In accordance with the authorisation received by your telegram signed "Private" of the 26th. November, I have the honour to report that I am making preparations for my journey and hope to leave for Moyale in the first week of January, taking Mr. Saffro, whose leave is now due, with me.

It will take a month to reach Moyale and a further month to Nairobi, and I shall spend two or three weeks if necessary at the former place, where I hope to see Fiteurri Wuldi and Canazmatch Gashi, visiting such points on the frontier as Mr. Hope may think advisable.
