Sir:-

I have the honour to report, with reference to my despatch No.35 of 24th December 1914, that, according to the latest information received by the Belgian Government here, the strength of the German forces available in East Africa amounted, about three weeks ago, to:-

10 to 12,000 Black Troops,

3 to 5,000 White "

These figures have been obtained from the Commander of the Congo Troops at Kivu, who, I am informed, has always proved reliable in such matters.

I understand that no details of the distribution of these German forces, later than those contained in the note of which a translation was enclosed in my despatch above referred to, have been received by the Belgian Government.
