In view of the serious situation on the frontier and of the possibility that the trouble may spread Sir E. Grey is not without some anxiety as to the present position of Mr. Thesiger, who is on his way from Adis Ababa to Nairqbi. Mr. Thesiger expected to reach Moyale about the 6th. instant, but Sir E. Grey is not aware whether he has yet arrived, and he would therefore suggest if Mr. Secretary Harcourt has no objection that a telegram should be addressed to the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate asking whether he reached

Under Secretary of State. Colonial Office. Moyale as expected, and adding that it is presumed that all necessary steps are being taken to keep him informed of the situation.
