It is proposed that Conference should endeavour to frame regulations for universal adoption dealing with minimum weight below which it shall be illegal to possess ivory or kill elephants regulation of trade

in ivory and rhinoceros horns; supply of Customs returns of all ivory and rhinoceros horn exported from African ports.
