With reference to your letter to .18016/1914 of the 20th instant, I am directed by Secretary Sir E. Grey to transmit to you herewith copy of a letter addressed by the Principal German Delegate of the Conference for the Protection of the African Elephant and Mainoceros to the Secretary of the Conference explaining the condition which the German Jovernment attach to the signature of the draft Convention by their belegate. A copy of a circular on the subject to the other Delegates is also enclosed.
