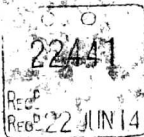

Grey to transmit to you herewith six copies in print of a report, dated the 15th. ultimo, by His Majesty's Minister at Adis Abeba on his recent journey from that capital to Nairobi through Moyale. Sir E. Grey desires to call Mr. Secretary Harcourt's attention to the important recommendations made by Mr. Thesiger in this report.
