

Sir:-

With reference to your letter of the 15th ultimo
(34951) on the subject of the disposal of the species
found on the fugitive offender Diechmann, I am directed
by Secretary Sir E. Grey to transmit to you a copy of a
note from the Russian Ambassador, referring to Article XV
of the Extradition Treaty between the United Kingdom and
Russia.

I am to observe that the provisions of the Extradition
Treaty may, strictly speaking, be held to be inapplicable
to the present case, since the proposal to conclude a
separate Agreement with Russia on the subject of Extra-
dition with British Protectorates is at present in abey-
ance and the fugitive Diechmann has been surrendered merely
under the provisions of the East Africa Ordinance. Sir
E. Grey would not however propose to raise this question
at the present time.

In view of all the circumstances, Sir, I would suggest, for Mr. Secretary Harcourt's concurrence, that a note might be addressed to the Russian Ambassador, pointing out that at the present moment it is doubtful whether any really safe method of sending back the actual species can be found, and suggesting, for the approval of the Russian Government, that it would be better if a draft for the amount were sent.
