Sir:-

I am directed by Secretary Sir E. Grey to state that a communication has been received from the German Government through the United States Ambassador forwarding a list of persons who should in the opinion of the German Government be set at liberty at once in virtue of the arrangement between it and His Majesty's Government by which civilians under seventeen years and persons over fifty-five years of age and all women and children shall be free to return to their native country.

On this list figures the name of Frau Schwechten alleged to be detained at Mombasa.

Sir E. Grey would be glad to learn what answer should be returned to the American Ambassador with regard to this person.
