

My telegram dated 14th February. Baggage camels for
 Hismaya. Report progress by telegram. In the event of
 a combatant camel corps being required for field service
 in north-east district British East Africa Protectorate,
 please telegraph whether any Indian Chief would
 volunteer services of 100 or more men and camels of his
 Imperial Service Camel Corps at the expense of British
 East Africa Protectorate, and whether you consider such
 employment unobjectionable on general grounds. Also
 whether such camels would be suitable for service in
 that country from point of view of climatic conditions
 and foodstuffs or grazing obtainable. Could the camelry
 of the Aden Troop be made available for this service, and
 if so in what strength.
