Sir,

I am directed by Mr. Secretary Harcourt to transmit to you to be laid before the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, the accompanying copy of a telegram from the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, requesting that a clerk for the Land Board of the Protectorate may be appointed.

2. In view of the importance of avoiding as far as possible any delay in dealing with land questions in the Protectorate, Mr. Harcourt has instructed the Crown Agents for the Colonies to engage a Clerk in accordance with Sir P. Girouard's wishes on a 30 months' agreement in the first instance, with salary at the rate of £130 per annum, rising by annual increments of £10 to £200 per annum, and he trusts that Their Lordships will approve of the appointment.

3. It will be seen that the cost of employing the clerk will be met this year from savings, and that provision will be made for the expenditure thereafter on the Estimates.
