12-7. Your 1350 "Cl. 4" Court of Inquiry being held regarding missing German prisoners and flag of truce at Tanga also promises to be a list of prisoners and number of dead is some 1000. A party of prisoners number unknown were hurried west of Tanga by the Germans to various posts. It will take time to [get] full particulars. Details are verified particulars of officers and in reported missing as soon as possible. Field returns to be being checked and number will be wired early regarding

but owing to mixing of units on ships at embarkation impossible to obtain field statements sooner. Steamer "Bajora" has been turned into hospital ship; is all seriously wounded. Tanga "Bajora" leaving for India soon. Progress of wounded full medical particulars follow tomorrow, also effectiveness of each unit arms equipment etc. Field returns now coming in and being checked.

Addressed to Secretary of State for India, repeated to Chief of the General Staff, Delhi.
