Sir,

With reference to my confidential despatch of this date on the subject of salaries of the Judiciary, and my secret despatch of the 26th May, 1910, in which I referred to the existing personnel of the Bench, I have the honour to ask that the whole matter might now be considered finally before the 31st March next.

2. In my secret despatch I stated that I thought it would be for the good of the Protectorate if transfers could be arranged for the Principal Judge and the Junior Judge. Over a year has now elapsed since this recommendation was made, and no acceptable transfer has been found possible for the Principal Judge. He is now occupied both in the

revision of the Laws, and in the production of Civil and Criminal Procedure Codes, and I would hesitate to recommend his transfer elsewhere. Some of his judgments in the past had given rise to considerable comment, but no such event has happened in the meanwhile, and I have every confidence after two year's work in the Colony that its best interests would be served by his continuance in its service.

3. With regard to the Junior Judge, I have been considerably impressed by the care with which he has considered several most important cases, and, though he has peculiar mannerisms which are apt to prejudice him, I think that on the whole his judgments are highly respected.

4. My opinion as to Judge Barth remains as before of the highest.
