HIS EXCELLENCY

SIR R. P. GIRDWOOD, R.E., K.C.M.G.

Sir,

We, the undersigned Members of the Pastoralists Association, and Settlers of the East African Protectorate, beg to approach you with the following Petition:

That your Petitioners have heard with regret and great misgivings, that a Warrant of Deportation has been issued against the Hon. Galbraith Cole, a Settler of this Protectorate, and a Member of this Association.

That your Petitioners can only infer that the reason of the deportation of Mr. Cole is owing to his acquittal by a jury, of a charge of murder preferred against him.

That your Petitioners would point out that Mr. Cole is the owner of large flocks of sheep and other property in this Protectorate, and that as a Settler he has always conducted himself in such a manner as

to receive the full benefit of the
white settlers of the Protectorate and your
Petitioners would further call your attention
to the good understanding and friendly
relations which have always existed between
Mr. Cole and his native tenant and tribes
with whom he has been in constant contact.

That your Petitioners humbly submit
that no charges such as that of endeavouring
to excite enmity between the People of East
Africa and His Majesty, or intriguing
against His Majesty's power and authority in
East Africa, could in our opinion be laid
at the door of the Hon. Galbraith Cole.

And your Petitioners further submit
that the Article of Deportation was never
intended to be applied against an individual
who had stood his trial and been acquitted
of a crime by a properly constituted Court.

Wherefore your Petitioners beg
you to accede to this, their request, and
cancel the order of deportation.

And your petitioners as in duty
bound will ever pray.
