Sir,

I have the honour to enclose herewith in original
 a petition which has been forwarded to me by the
 Convention of Associations praying for elective non-
 official members of the Legislative Council.

2. This petition is signed by 373 people, over 100
 of whom are South African Dutch. According to the
 census return, which is probably incomplete, there
 are in the Protectorate 888 Europeans (excluding
 officials and missionaries) following various callings.
 The number of signatories to the petition is therefore
 less than half the non-official male European population.

Though I do not think the time is ripe for
ejective non-official membership of the Legislative
Council, I should not be adverse to recommending the
procedure followed in the appointment of members for
the Education and Land Boards. The procedure followed
in these cases is for the Convention of Associations
to submit to me a list of names, from which I select
persons who in my opinion are suitable to sit on the
Board. If you feel disposed to sanction a similar
scheme for the appointment of non-official members
of the Legislative Council it would give general
satisfaction to the European residents.
