Sir,

With reference to your letter No. 12352/1911 of the 28th of April, regarding new leave regulations etc. for the East African Protectorates, I have the honour to inform you that we have received a number of leave certificates from Uganda and East Africa, in all of which it is stated that vacation and return leave have been granted.

2. In the case of Uganda, we are requested to obtain an agreement from each officer, before issuing his return leave salary, to the effect that he will repay such return leave salary if he does not return to his duties, but no such request is made in the case of East Africa.

3. In the circumstances we shall be glad to know if the Secretary of State wishes us to enter into such agreements in all cases of officers at present serving in these Protectorates and if so whether the enclosed draft agreement, based on that already in use for the West African Colonies and Protectorates meets with his approval.
