I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th of July, No. 19859/1911, informing us that the Secretary of State has had under his consideration the question of the remuneration to be paid to ships' surgeons for attendance on Government Officers of the East Africa Protectorates embarked as invalids without a Government medical officer in charge, and instructing us to approach the Union Castle Company and the Peninsular & Oriental Company to endeavour to make arrangements with them for the remuneration of ships' surgeons on the terms shown in the form enclosed in your letter.

2. In reply, I have to report for the information of the Secretary of State that the terms shown in the form are acceptable to the two Companies.

3. With regard to the fourth paragraph of your letter pointing out that it would be advantageous if ships' surgeons could attend a short course of instruction in tropical medicine at a School of Tropical Medicine, the Peninsular & Oriental Company inform us that at the present moment they find it difficult at times to obtain the number of surgeons they require for their ships, but that the gentlemen who are in their service are all familiar with tropical diseases. 
that they are quite in sympathy with the suggestion and that they will be pleased to give every facility to their present surgeons to attend the London School of Tropical Medicine and to endeavour in future, so far as is possible, to obtain the services of surgeons who have attended this institution.

4 We enclose copies of the lists of medical equipment carried on board the ships of the two Companies which are employed for conveyance of Government passengers to the East Africa Protectorates. The Union Castle Company in forwarding the list of medical equipment state that this is carried out in accordance with the Board of Trade requirements (as per list No. 1 and 2), additional stores be supplied to each steamer as per list No. 3. Special medicine, in tabloid or other convenient form, is also supplied on the requisition of the surgeon.

2. Whenever an Officer of the Governments of Somaliland, the East Africa Protectorate, Uganda, or Nyasaland is embarked as an invalid, the Principal Medical Officer of the invalid's Protectorate, or an Officer deputed by him, will furnish the Master of the ship with a certificate to the effect that he is embarked as such. All claims for remuneration for attendance on Protectorate Government Officers must be accompanied by these certificates.
