Sir,

With reference to semi-official correspondence
regarding the payment of travelling expenses of nurses
appointed to the East African Protectorates I have the
honour to state that the practice in force in the case
of nurses appointed to the West African Service is to pay
claims for their travelling expenses (3rd class railway
fare from port of disembarkation to destination) on returning
to this country on leave of absence and when required to
present themselves for medical examination while on leave in
accordance with instructions contained in the Secretary of
State's letter No. 17640/1904 of the 13th of June 1904. We
have also received semi-official instructions (a copy of the
same is enclosed) to the effect that on return to the
Colony after leave of absence nurses should claim their
expenses on arrival in West Africa. I would also refer
you to the Secretary of State's letter 3035/1903 of 19.2.03.

2. It is the present practice with regard to nurses
appointed to the East Africa Protectorates to pay their ex-
penses to the port of embarkation on first appointment, but
we shall be glad to receive the Secretary of State's in-
structions as to the payment of claims for travelling ex-
penses (a) on return to this country on leave of absence
(b) to

The Under-Secretary of State.
