The security of the Head Native Clerk.

Sir,

I have the honour to report for the information of the Right Honourable Lewis Harcourt that the security of the Head Native Clerk and Cashier of this Office, Mr. Burjorji Ratanji Davar has been a subject of correspondence demi-officially between myself and the Hon'ble Mr. G.G. Bowring.- The latter approves of Mr. Davar's post being added to the List of the East Africa Secured Posts and I should be greatly obliged if the Right Honourable Lewis Harcourt would be pleased to sanction the issue of the necessary instructions to the Crown Agents for the Colonies to allow of this being done.-

2. At present Mr. Davar is secured under a local Policy of Guarantee for Rs. 5000/- expiring the 31st May 1911 - a copy of which was transmitted with my letter of the 27th June 1906.-

3. Mr. Bowring has suggested that the premium may be charged by the Crown Agents to the East Africa Protectorate with whom it will be adjusted by my office.-
