Dear Sir,

I am much obliged for the copy of the Bulletin
Official du Congo Belge and I am glad to see from the
Game Regulations contained therein that no elephant
may be killed whose tusks do not weigh at least 10 kilos
a piece (over 20 lbs). I would like to take this
opportunity of calling again upon the Foreign Office and
Colonial Office the importance of having a consistent
standard weight throughout British possessions in
Africa below which ivory may not be traded in or export-
ed. this weight should be at least 25 lbs, preferably
30 lbs.

At present the different Protectorates have differ-
ent minimums, the East African Protectorate 30 lbs.
Gambia 11 lbs. and so forth.
