With reference to your letter 21875/1910 of the
17th November last I am directed by Secretary Sir
Edward Gray to transmit to you herewith a copy of a
letter from the Exchequer and Audit Department respect-
ing the transfer of the Colonial Audit service from the
control and direction of the Comptroller and Auditor
General to that of the Secretary of State for the
Colonies.

With reference to the letter from this Department
4190/10 of the 6th of December last I am to state
that Sir E. Gray has consulted the Zanzibar authorities
and concurs in the transfer of responsibility for the
audit of the accounts of the Zanzibar Government from
the Comptroller and Auditor General to the Director of
Colonial Audit. He is of opinion that on every ground
it is advisable that the audit of the Zanzibar accounts
should continue to be carried on as heretofore under

the supervision of the Local Auditor of East Africa rather than by a separate establishment located in Zanzibar.

Sir E. Grey would be glad if Mr. Secretary Harcourt will give his sanction to the arrangement and issue the necessary orders accordingly.

Sir:-

I am directed by the Comptroller and Auditor General to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State, that, with the concurrence of the Lord Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury the Secretary of State for the Colonies has approved the recommendations made by an inter-departmental Committee, which was appointed in January last to consider the details of a scheme proposed by His Majesty for the transfer of the Colonial Audit Service from the control and direction of the Comptroller and Auditor General to that of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

2. A copy of the Report of the Colonial Audit Committee (Miscellaneous No. 246) is enclosed from which it will be seen that the scheme provides that so much of the work as has hitherto been undertaken, on behalf of the Secretary of State,

State for the Colonies, by the Comptroller and Auditor.

General, shall be transferred to a new department, to be called "The Colonial Audit Department" with a central establishment in London, connected with the Colonial Office, and working under the supervision of an Officer styled the "Director of Colonial Audit".

3. The scheme has been sanctioned with effect from 1st May last, and the home establishment of the new Department has been recruited from the staff of the Exchequer and Audit Department, it being arranged, however, that the examination of the Accounts of the various Colonies and Protectorates for 1909 and 1909-10, shall continue to be carried on under the supervision of the Comptroller and Auditor General.

4. The Local Auditor of East Africa, whose work will continue to be done under existing conditions subject only to the age referred to, is, as the Secretary of State is now responsible, under the arrangements entered into with the department, for the audit, on behalf of the Foreign Office, of the Accounts of the Zanzibar Government,

and

and the Comptroller and Auditor General assumes that Sir Edward Grey will not be unwilling that these arrangements should be continued under the altered constitution of the Colonial Audit Service; the Director of Colonial Audit becoming responsible for the work, commencing with the Accounts for the Year 1910.

D. Should the Secretary of State concur in this transfer of responsibility for the audit of the Accounts of the Minister Government from the Comptroller and Auditor General to the Director of Colonial Audit, I would suggest that steps may be taken as soon as possible to obtain the sanction of the Colonial Office for such an arrangement.
