so the points raised by Sir P. Girouard in his despatch. he Thesiger expressed the opinion that nothing could be done at Adis Ababa for sent, but that if the authorities of the British East Africa Protectorate would patrol the country in the neighbourhood of the proposed frontier and arrest they could discover, the Abyssinians would, in all probability, themselves definite settlement of the frontier at no very distant date.

The siger went on to say that in his opinion, the proposals now put forward I' Girouard would provide a suitable basis for negotiation, although it might ssary for him at a later stage to recommend the transfer to the Abyssinians of what larger area of territory in the vicinity of Lake Rudolf.

his Majesty's Government concur in the opinion expressed by Mr. Thesiger at eeting, but hope that it may be found possible to carry through the negotiations basis proposed by Sir P. Girouard.
