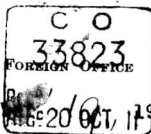

Sir:-

I am directed by Secretary Sir E. Grey to state for the information of Mr. Secretary Harcourt that the question has recently arisen whether the medical officers of the Zanzibar Government should properly be considered as entitled to pension or not.

The view held in this Department has been that these officers, who are permitted to engage in private practice, and thus do not devote their whole time to the Government service, should not, for this reason, be placed on the list of pensionable officers.

Before deciding whether to adhere to this decision Sir E. Grey would be glad to learn whether pensions are granted to medical officers serving under your Department in East Africa or other places where the circumstances are similar to those in Zanzibar, and if so, whether such officers are permitted

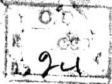
