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Sir: -

I have the honour to report that the "Post" of to-day's date states that the next Colonial Budget will contain an item providing for the continuation of the Central Railway of German Hast Africa from Tabora to Ujiji. It is hoped, the paper states, that this prolongation can be carried out for a sum of 40,000,000 Marks (£2,000,000), especially as an economy of £400,000 is being effected on the construction of the section from Morogoro to Tabora. The reason given by the Administration of German East Africa for this project is that the present line can only be profitably run if it is continued as far as the rich cattle districts lying near Lake Tanganyika; moreover it will be of particular importance for the traffic with the Congo, which at present passes over English lines. The "Post" states that an increase in the nut tax is contemplated in order
