Sir,

I have the honor to place before you, for your consideration, my application for a Pension.

My first husband, Major James Bond Clarke, of the Cameronians, died in Lucknow, India, in Jan'y: 1891. In 1892 I married again, Major Colin Campbell Boileau, 5th Bengal Cavalry - he retired from the Service on 20th December 1902 and died on Fe. 28th of this year, in Nairobi, British East Africa, where he was in Government Service, in the Veterinary Dept. and had also served in the P.W.D. and Agricultural Dept. He lost his life in the execution of his duty, having cattle in his charge, in the Fort Hall district, where the leopards are very numerous, and were endangering the cattle. On Dec. and 1910, he was setting a gun trap for them, when it accidentally went off and shot him through the left knee. He was taken to Nairobi Hospital and after a month it was found necessary to amputate the leg, and later a second operation was performed. He rallied from this, but on Fe. 28th, when the Drs. had pronounced him to be out of danger, and we were leaving for England on that very day, secondary haemorrhage set in and he died

died the following day.

I am totally unprovided for, having no private means, so trust that my case may receive your favourable consideration.
