Another new arrangement proposed (including affl. a draughtsman &c) & so far as current year is concerned, but cannot consent to their continuance during 1911-12 without receipt of report related to the same letter from Mr. Bayly soon after 1st April 1911. It must be regarded as contingent until available anti-harvest final decision.

Read

The Tree men are well in their rights in demanding we rebot or re-sale leases - its estimated yield, but it is unthinkable that they should now be allowed to stop the work of Coast Head Settlement for lack of it. Nor do I suppose that they have any intention of trying to do so. I read the last sentence of their letter to mean that the work may go on, unless funds for which provision has been made even in 1911-12, pending the receipt consideration of the report.

Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 21st ultimo (37034/1910) and its enclosures relative to the estimated expenditure of Coast Land Settlement in the East Africa Protectorate for the year 1911-12.

In reply I am to invite Mr. Secretary Harcourt's attention to the letter from this Department of the 6th August last and to express Their Lordships' regret that They have not yet been furnished with the report asked for in the penultimate paragraph of that letter on the scale and estimated yield of the fees to be charged under the new scheme. Without such a report My Lords do not feel in a position adequately to discuss the expenditure now proposed, and while They will not withhold Their sanction so far as the current year is concerned to the new arrangements which the Governor intends to put in force (including the appointment of a draftsman with salary at the rate of £160 per annum, as proposed in Mr. Just's letter of the 16th instant (1060/E.A.P)), They regret that They cannot consent to the continuance of these arrangements in 1911-12 until They have had an opportunity of considering the report in question. Any provision therefore which is made in the Estimates for the ensuing year must be regarded as


