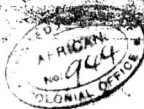

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 3rd instant (13th/1910-11) and the accompanying copy of a despatch from the Officer Administering the Government of the East Africa Protectorate enclosing a fourth Supplementary Estimate of expenditure for the year 1910-11.
