Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Piddes' letter of the 3rd instant (8708/1911) relative to the proposed grant of compassionate gratuities to two officers in the service of the East Africa Protectorate, who have been retired on the ground of ill-health after service of 8 and 12 years respectively.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr. Secretary Harcourt that, in the opinion of Their Lordships, the conditions prescribed by Section 4 of the Superannuation Act, 1887, must apply to the grant of compassionate gratuities to un pensionable employees of the Protectorate i.e. that there must be 15 completed years of service in the case of retirement for ill health or 7 years service in the case of abolition of office.

My Lords therefore regret to be unable to concur in the award of gratuities in the present cases, and in this connection I am to refer to the Treasury Letter of 12th January 1907 (349/07) relative to the case of Mr. de Souza.
