Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 21st instant No. 30057/1911 forwarding copy of a telegram sent to the Colonial Office at the instance of certain residents in Nairobi including the Manager of our branch in that place.

We cannot believe that our Manager was acting in his official capacity as the representative of the Bank in signing the message in question as any such action would have been contrary to his Head Office instructions, which are in effect not to allow his own or the Bank's name to be mixed up in local politics. We are however calling on Mr Playfair for a full explanation of why he should have put his name to such a message as that a copy of which you send us.


