Sir,

I have the honour to transmit to you, a copy of a despatch which I have addressed to the Governor of Uganda, relating to a vacancy for an Assistant Superintendent of Police in that Protectorate caused by the resignation of Mr. S.P. Hart, and to request that you will be good enough to offer the appointment to Mr. M.St.C. Thom on the terms stated in paragraph 3 of the enclosed despatch. The salary of the appointment is £600 per annum and quarters are provided free of rent (but not of rates or similar outgoings) or an allowance is given in lieu. In view of the fact that the Uganda Police are at present shorthanded, I should be glad if you would arrange for Mr. Thom's transfer as soon as possible.

2. I have further to invite your attention to paragraph 4 of the enclosed despatch, and to request that every encouragement to pass the promotion examination may be given to those non-commissioned officers in the East Africa Protectorate Police force who are considered socially fitted for commissioned rank in order that no difficulty may arise when their turn for promotion arrives.

3. Mr. Thom's vacancy will presumably be filled

filled by the promotion of Mr. E.R.S. Taylor, if Mr. Skinner takes the place of Mr. Lydford, and this will leave a vacancy for an Assistant Inspector. Captain Edwards has strongly recommended that vacancies for Assistant Inspectors in the East Africa Protectorate should be filled by promotion of European Constables rather than by the direct appointment of non-commissioned officers from this country. This recommendation accords with the decision in my Confidential despatch of the 30th of June, as to the type of man who should be selected for the appointments of Assistant Inspector and Inspector, and indeed it has already been accepted in principle in connection with the promotion of Lance Corporal Hillyer, while the form of agreement used for European Police Constables makes a reference to the possibility of their being promoted to the rank of Inspector. As it is clear from your despatch No: 315 of the 6th of June, that you concur in Captain Edwards recommendation, I approve of this procedure being adopted in future. In these circumstances I should be glad if you would recommend European Constables for promotion to the rank of Assistant Inspector to fill the following vacancies:-

(a) The vacancy referred to in paragraph 5 of my confidential despatch of the 30th of June, which will now be withdrawn from the Crown Agents for the Colonies.

(b)

(b) The vacancy consequent upon Mr. Reilly's transfer to Uganda, if my recommendation as to his transfer meets with your approval.

(c) The vacancy now caused by Mr. Thom's promotion.

The Crown Agents will be instructed to obtain two more third grade Constables to take the place of these Constables who are promoted to fill vacancies (a) and (c) above; and when I learn whether or not Mr. Reilly has been transferred to Uganda, action will be taken to obtain another third grade constable, if necessary, to fill vacancy (b).

The vacancy caused by Mr. Lydford's resignation has, as you are aware, been offered to Corporal Roberts who is now serving in Somaliland.
