Sir

Re your letter of 29th 1900/1910
dated 17-1-10 & by the same
reference advise that the
Government of India ruled
the stoppage of subsistence
allowance for European Police
constables. My intention was
that the Governor had not
the power to do so. Para 284
of the Regulations for Colonial
Service states that the rates
for subsistence allowance etc.
shall be laid down in Council
with the approval of the Secretary
of States. Believing that I
come under Para 2 of Circular
dated Bombay Dec 15th 1902
I fail to see that stoppage
could be carried out until
the case has been referred
by the same authority by
which it was issued.
