We are instructed to say that, under all the circumstances, our Clients greatly regret that Mr. Harcourt is unable to invite the Governor of the Protectorate to modify the action already taken, and that Mr. Harcourt is in a position to comply with the other requests made in our letter.

Our Clients express considerable surprise that you have not stated definitely whether the procedure followed in this case was in strict accordance with that prescribed by Section 2 of the Africa Order in Council, 1902, and we have been instructed to make and send you a copy of the Opinion of Sir Edward Carson, K.C., and Mr. William Bowstead referred to in our previous letter.
