Travelling allowances

Minutes as to all of these agreements

Mr. Butler.

I have placed below agreements in use in East Africa, which I have obtained from the Crown Agents. You will see that the clause as to Travelling Allowances is practically the same in all cases, (paragraph 7 in the Engineers' Agreement for Uganda Railway is a little differently worded, but in sense is the same). I think that in all East African Agreements we had better substitute for the present clause the clause "When travelling on duty away from his station in the Protectorate the person engaged either will be provided with transport or will be paid travelling expenses according to the scale laid down for transport and travelling expenses respectively in the 'Protectorate'".

of Middlesex acting for and on behalf of
the Government of the East Africa
Protectorate (hereinafter called
the Government) of the one part and
Ronald Edric Penney of 24
Mallory Road Colchester in the
County of Essex of the other part

Whereby it is agreed by and between
the parties hereto as follows:

1. The said Ronald Edric Penney hereinafter
called the person engaged is hereby selected for
appointment as a Second Engineer in the Uganda
Railway Steamer Service on Lake Victoria upon the
terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.
2. The person engaged shall proceed to East
Africa when directed by the Crown Agents for the
Colonies there to perform the duties of his appoint-
ment for the period of three years commencing
from the date of arrival at Mombasa but this period
may be extended as provided for in Clause 17.
3. The duties of the person engaged shall include
the usual duties of the appointment and in addition
any other suitable duties either ashore or afloat
which the Government may call upon him to
perform.
4. The person engaged shall on arrival in
the Protectorate and during the time he shall
continue in the service of the Government reside
in such place and occupy himself in such manner

as the Government through its properly qualified officers shall direct, and he shall not either directly or indirectly engage or be concerned in any other service or business however or receive commissions or profits of any kind but shall devote the whole of his time and attention to the service of the Government and shall use his utmost exertions to promote the interests of the Government.

5. The Government shall provide the person engaged with a free passage to Mombasa together with railway fare third class to port of embarkation and on the satisfactory conclusion of his engagement and subject to clause 8 and 9 will a free passage home provided he claims and avails himself of such return passage within two months from the date of such engagement. Passage in this agreement means a second class passage.

6. The person engaged shall be paid a salary at the rate of Two thousand seven hundred Rupees (Rs 2700) per annum rising after one and a half years service to Three thousand Rupees (Rs 3000) per annum and increment will be granted unless the conduct and diligence of the person engaged have been approved. His salary is liable to a deduction not exceeding five pounds (£5) per month and if such deductions shall amount to his sum paid for his passage to the Protectorate including railway fare paid by the Government will remain until the termination of this engagement when if his conduct has been satisfactory the whole amount will be repaid to him but if he shall resign his appointment for any other cause than ill health (not caused by his own misconduct) or shall be dismissed from his employment for misconduct the cost of his passage (including railway fare) will be repaid out of the sum so deducted. Half salary will be paid during the voyage.

7. The Government shall provide the person engaged with free quarters or an allowance to either provide him with train or necessary travelling expenses.

on duty away from his station. Free quarters means quarters free of rent but not of rates and similar outgoings

8. If the person engaged shall be compelled by reason of ill health not caused by his own misconduct to resign his appointment or at any time it shall be certified by a duly qualified medical officer employed by the Government that he is incapable on physical grounds of rendering further efficient service in the Protectorate the Government shall pay him his salary up to the date of such resignation or certificate and shall file in the Advocate of the Vice Presidency with a free passage to England provided that he claims and avails himself of such return passage within two months but he shall have another claim in the Government. If he shall resign his appointment from any other cause he shall

referred to the Government the amount paid for his passage to Mombasa including railway fare and if he leaves the Protectorate within time shall not be entitled to a return passage to England. A certificate signed by a duly qualified medical officer employed by the Government shall be conclusive evidence on the question whether or not the person engaged was compelled to resign his appointment by reason of ill health within the meaning of this clause.

9. If the person engaged shall at any time neglect or refuse or from any cause excepting ill health not caused by his own misconduct (as provided

in Clause 8) become unable to carry out all or
the clauses of this agreement, or any of the duties
required of him or any of the posts of the Government
or their offices, or shall offend verbally or otherwise
directly or indirectly in respect of the affairs of the
Government, without reason not in the employment
of the Government, it shall publish directly or indirectly
any document or information of any kind, affecting the
Government or held in any manner misconduct towards
it shall be competent for the Government to declare his
employment at an end and he shall be forthwith
dismissed by the Government and all rights and advantages
accruing to him by this agreement shall cease and
he shall be liable to any demand the amount
paid for his passage to Montreal including railway
fare.

11. The Government may at any time determine the
employment of the person engaged by giving him three
months notice in writing or in paying him compensation
therefor and in either case if he goes to the Provinces
at the time of such determination of his engagement
providing him with a free passage to England provided
that he returns and avails himself of such return passage
within two months. He shall not in either case be
entitled to half pay during the voyage home unless
specally granted by the Government.

12. In the event of any pecuniary damage arising
from the person engaged, according to failing to
comply with any standing order or departmental
instruction or from any neglect of duty whatever
on his part he may be liable to deduction from his
salary to make good the damage or any part thereof
the amount of which shall be fixed by the Government

13. If the person engaged shall absent himself from
duty through ill-health he shall produce a medical

certificate to that effect signed by a medical officer
employed by the Government for that purpose and
if his sickness should be so great though his name
is properly conducted or if he should absent himself
from his work from any cause whatever without
leave he shall forfeit his salary for the number of
days he shall be absent from duty.

14. The person engaged shall by indulgence on my
own part impeach himself for the performance of
and of his duties his salary shall be liable to reduction
to one extent not exceeding one half thereof and for
each period as the Head of the Department shall determine.

15. If the person engaged shall commit any offence
in the agreement or if any law or regulation
or shall in any way misconduct himself the Head
of his Department may after such enquiry and
upon such evidence as he may think fit fix upon him
any amount not exceeding five pounds £5.

16. The person engaged shall upon request furnish such
security and in such form as the Government may
decide upon for the faithful and honest discharge of
his duties and if any premium is payable in
respect of such security it may be deducted from
his salary by the Government.

17. The Government shall deduct each month from
the salary of the person engaged the sum of £1.
which sum shall be
payable by the Canadian Agent for the balance due
England.

18. If the person engaged make present to him for
acceptance a bill drawn upon them by the Government
in the usual and ordinary way.

19. Three months prior to the expiration of this agreement
the person engaged shall give notice in writing to the
Government whether he desires to remain in its

employment and if the Government desire to retain his services he may, thereupon be re-engaged in such terms and for such periods as may be mutually agreed.

8. On the part of the person engaged becoming entitled to payment under the agreement of any amount in consideration of salary return passage money or passage delivery of other expenses it will be the right of the Crown Agent to call upon the sum to pay to the Crown Agent a certificate for the amount of the amount so due before payment will be effected.

9. The Crown Agent for the balance shall not be in any way personally liable for anything arising out of this agreement.

 Between the Crown Agents for the Colonies, Whitehall Gardens, London, acting on behalf of
 the Government of the Nyasaland Protectorate (hereinafter called the Government) and

in the County of _____

(hereinafter called the person engaged).

1. The person engaged agrees to proceed to the Nyasaland Protectorate (hereinafter called the Protectorate) when and as directed by the Crown Agents for the Colonies, and undertake that he will there diligently and faithfully perform the duties of _____ for the term of _____
 will act in all respects according to the instructions or directions given to him by the Government through the Head of his Department or other duly authorized officers. In this Agreement the term "Head of his Department" shall mean the person for the time being acting as Head of his Department.

2. The salary of the office is at the rate of _____ pounds per annum rising to _____ pounds per annum by annual increments of _____ pounds.

3. The Government shall deduct each month from the salary of the person engaged the sum of £ _____ which amount shall be paid in England by the Crown Agents for the Colonies to the _____ of the person engaged, on his presenting to them a bill drawn upon them by the Government in his favour and endorsed by his _____.

4. This Agreement is subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed, and the Schedule shall be read and construed as a part of the Agreement.

5. The Crown Agents for the Colonies shall not be in any way personally liable for anything arising out of this Agreement.

SCHEDULE.

Term of engagement.

1.—The engagement of the person engaged is for a tour of thirty months, ~~and~~ ^{and} to be extended as provided for in Clause 15.

Duties.

2.—The duties of the person engaged shall include the usual duties of the office for which he is engaged, and any other suitable duties which the Government may call upon him to perform. The person engaged shall reside in such place and occupy himself in such manner as the Government, through its duly authorised officers, shall direct, and he shall not, either directly or indirectly, engage or be concerned in any other service or business whatsoever or receive any commission or profit of any kind, but shall devote the whole of his time and attention to the interests of the Government and shall use his utmost exertions to promote the interests of the Government.

Salary.

3.—(a) Half salary will be paid from the date of embarkation on first engagement. Full salary will begin from the date of disembarkation on the African Coast.

Quarters.

(b) No increment of salary will be granted to the person engaged unless his conduct and diligence have been approved. The evidence of such approval shall be a certificate signed by the Head of his department, countersigned by such officer as the Government may designate for the purpose.

Traveling allowance.

4.—The salary of the person engaged may be liable to deduction under Clauses 10, 11, 12 and 14.

The person engaged shall be supplied with quarters, and shall receive an allowance in lieu thereof, as the Government shall consider reasonable, "inference" in this agreement means one-quarter tree of rent, but not of rates and imposts, and so on.

Passages.

5.—When travelling on duty away from his station in the Protectorate the person engaged shall be provided with transport, or the usual and necessary expenses.

6.—(a) Passage in this agreement means second class passage, and includes conveyance by railway, steamer or other transport between the African Coast and the station of the person engaged in the Protectorate, and conveyance by railway, second class, on the Continent of Europe where necessary.

Leave.

(b) The Government shall provide the person engaged with a free passage to the Protectorate, and, subject to Clauses 7, 8, and 9, with a passage back again to England on the satisfactory expiration of his engagement, provided he leaves for England within two months of such expiration.

(c) The Government shall provide the person engaged with a full port of embarkation on first engagement.

7.—(a) If the person engaged shall be compelled by reason of ill-health not caused by his own misconduct to resign his office, or if at any time it shall be certified by a duly qualified medical officer employed by the Government that he is incapable ~~on medical grounds~~ of rendering further efficient service in the Protectorate, the Government shall pay him full salary ~~for the period he is ordered to travel~~ not including the date of departure from the African Coast of the first steamer by which is the opinion of the Government he could have embarked, and half salary during the time necessarily spent on the passage to England, and shall provide him with a free passage to England provided he embarks within two months of the date of such resignation or certificate; but he shall have no further claim on the Government.

(b) A certificate signed by a duly qualified medical officer employed by the Government shall be conclusive evidence on the question whether or not the person engaged was compelled to resign his office by reason of ill-health within the meaning of this clause.

8. If the person engaged shall at any time neglect or refuse or from any cause (excepting ill-health not caused by his own misconduct, as provided in Clause 7) become unable to perform any of his duties or to comply with any order, or shall disclose any information respecting the affairs of the Government to any person not in the employment of the Government, or shall in any manner misconduct himself, the Government may dismiss him, and on such dismissal all rights and advantages reserved to him by this agreement shall cease, and he shall be liable to repay to the Government on demand the amount paid for his passage to the Protectorate. Dismissal.

9.—(a) The Government may at any time determine the engagement of the person engaged on giving him three months notice in writing, or on paying him one month's salary, and in either case if he is in the Protectorate at the time, furnishing him with a free passage to England, provided that he claims and avails himself of such return passage within two months of such determination. Determination of engagement.

(b) The person engaged may, at any time after the expiration of three months from the commencement of any residential service, determine his engagement on giving to the Government three months notice in writing, or on paying him one month's salary, and in either case repaying the cost of his passage to the Protectorate. He shall not in either case be entitled to a return passage to England.

10.—In the event of any pecuniary damage arising from the person engaged disregarding or failing to comply with any order, standing order, or departmental instruction or from any neglect or duty whatsoever on his part, he may be liable to a deduction from his salary to make good the damage or any part thereof, the amount of which shall be fixed by the Head of his Department. Liability to make good damage.

11.—If the person engaged shall absent himself from duty through ill-health he shall produce a medical certificate to that effect signed by a medical officer appointed by the Government for that purpose and if his sickness should be caused through his own impropriety of conduct he shall forfeit his salary for the number of days he shall be absent from duty. If he shall absent himself from his work for any cause whatever without leave he shall forfeit his salary for the number of days he shall be absent from ~~work~~ and it shall be lawful for the Government to dismiss him forthwith as for misconduct. Absence from duty.

Pines.

12.—If the person engaged shall—

- (a) Disregard, without sufficient reason, fail to comply with any order, standing order, or departmental regulation;
- or (b) Injures himself in the performance of any of his duties by indulgence, in any negligent manner;
- or (c) In any manner misconduct himself;

the Head of his Department may, after such investigation and upon such evidence as he may think fit, and in addition to or in lieu of exercising any other powers reserved to him under this agreement, cause the person engaged to any extent not exceeding one hundred pounds (£10), or suspend him from work, with loss of pay and allowances for any period not exceeding one calendar month and any such fines and the pay corresponding to any such suspension may be deducted from any money which would otherwise be due under this agreement.

13.—(a) On the completion of thirty months continuous residential service at the Protectorate the person engaged may if the exigencies of the service permit be granted three months leave of absence on full salary (known as vacation leave) and if he is returning to the Protectorate on re-engagement a further three months leave of absence on full salary (known as return leave). Should the person engaged fail to return to the Protectorate at the expiration of his return leave he will return to the Government on demand the amount which may have been paid to him in respect of such return leave.

(b) Leave is to be had to begin on the date the person engaged leaves the African Coast, and in the case of return have to end on his return to the Coast on his way to resume his duties.

Security.

14.—The person engaged shall, if so required by the Government, furnish such security and in such form as the Government may decide upon for the faithful and honest discharge of his duties and if any premium is payable in respect of such security it may be deducted from his salary by the Government.

15.—Three months before the date on which he will be due to leave the Protectorate at the end of the tour of service, the person engaged shall give notice in writing to the Government whether he desires to remain in its employment, and the Government shall thereupon decide whether it will offer him further employment, in which case the re-engagement will be on such terms and for such period as may be mutually agreed.

Payment in England.

16.—In the event of the person engaged being entitled on the expiration of this agreement to any payment in England, before payment can be made it will be necessary for him to produce to the Crown Agents a certificate from the Government of the amount due.

Powers of
Crown
Agents.

17.—When the person engaged is not in the Protectorate, the Crown Agents for the Colonies, when directed by the Government or by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, shall be competent to exercise any of the powers of the Government under this agreement.
