Sir,

I have the honour to submit the following matter for your consideration and decision:

2. Mr Read has just left East Africa for England, after paying a short visit to this country, and owing to the desire on the part of the settlers and others here to meet him, and the wish on my part that as a representative of the Colonial Office he should meet as many influential people as possible, it was necessary for me to give a large number of public dinners. In fact during his stay in Nairobi some 200 people were entertained and a large reception was held at Nakuru to which all the settlers and officials in that district were invited.

3. I understand that some £300 was allowed to Sir Charles Eliot in 1902 towards the cost of entertaining Mr Chamberlain who was then visiting this country, and in 1907, I am informed, a refund was made to Sir James Hayes Sadler for expenditure incurred in entertaining Mr Churchill during his visit
